PARENT/VISITOR POLICY REMINDER

For the safety of all of our children, all parents and visitors must enter the school through the Main Street entrance. Please do not attempt to enter at another entrance or ask a child or staff member to open or hold open another entrance for you. During drop-off (8:10-8:30) the entrance to the kindergarten wing, located by the Kenton parking lot, will also be open for parents to walk their children to their classrooms.

When entering the main entrance, all visitors will be greeted at our security window by a staff person and required to submit a valid ID in exchange for a Visitor's Pass. This visitor necklace must be worn around the neck during the entire visit. Upon leaving the building, the ID will be returned to the visitor when the Visitor's Pass is turned in. This step will enable us to track who is in our building at all times in order to ensure the safety of both our children and our visitors. We thank all of the parents for being cooperative in this policy.

LUNCH DAYS/HOT LUNCH

Please note that Monday and Wednesday are fleishig/pareve days and Tuesday, Thursday and Friday are milchig/pareve days.

ACHDS has chosen to offer its own hot lunch program for the upcoming school year. Hot lunch will be served 3 days per week - Monday, Wednesday and Thursday. Food will be provided by Starr Kosher Catering. In addition, Student Council will be offering its Tel Aviv pizza lunch fundraiser every Tuesday.

Hot lunch sign up is available twice a year. The first session ends at winter break. Late sign ups will not be accepted.

SCHOOL BUS SAFETY

About 22 million students nationwide begin and end their school day on a bus. Buses are considered nearly 2,000 times safer than the family car. Most cases of injury or death are not from crashes, but due to entering and exiting the bus. Here are some common bus safety tips for your children:

- --Have a safe place to wait for the bus, away from traffic and the street.
- --Stay away from the bus until it comes to a complete stop and the driver signals to enter.
- --The area around the school bus is considered the 'Danger Zone.' Students are advised to stay five large steps from the front of the bus and three large steps from the side of the bus when walking around it. NEVER walk behind the bus and stay away from the wheel wells.
- --At your stop, wait for the bus to stop completely before getting up from your seat.

BUS/CARPOOL NOTICE

We would like to thank all of our parents and staff for their cooperation with our pickup and dismissal procedures. Working together will enable us to ensure a safer and smoother process. In cooperation with the Skokie Police Department, please note the following:

MORNING: Parents will be allowed to stop on Main Street for a few moments only to drop off their children. If you leave your car for even a moment, the police may ticket you. The Kilpatrick parking lot and entrance is for teachers only. Upon arrival, please pull as far down on Main Street as possible in order to ease the flow of traffic.

Kindergarten Parents who would like to bring their children inside the building should park on either side of Kenton or in the Kenton Parking Lot. Those wishing to park on the west side of Kenton must go around the building on Elm Terrace and come around onto Kenton. Please be careful not to speed, and pay extra attention to stay on the correct side of the road while driving on Elm Terrace. K-turns and double parking on Kenton are strictly prohibited. Using driveways to turn around is illegal and will be ticketed by the Skokie Police. Drop-off for Kindergarten begins at 8:20 AM. To help support larger carpools, designated drop-off rooms are available for Kindergarten children who arrive between 8:10 and 8:20 AM. Please note: There is no supervision before 8:10 AM.

AFTERNOON: Main Street is reserved for buses only – if you stop for even a moment, you will be subject to a ticket. The **Kilpatrick** parking lot will be available at 3:55 p.m. for Skokie, Lincolnwood, and Peterson Park carpools. If you plan to back into a parking space, you must do so before the 3:55 bell rings. Once the students are dismissed we ask that you not back into spaces. Also, students are not allowed to cross the parking lot unattended. Students can wait for an adult to cross them or walk around the perimeter of the parking lot to get to the other side. Any students not picked up by 4:10 will be brought to the front office to wait for their ride. Rogers Park carpools will pick up on **Kenton**. You are asked to slowly come around the block (Kilpatrick to Elm Terrace to Kenton) to get into the carpool line. Make sure that your carpool number is showing so we can call your students to come outside. Please continue to move up along the curb as other cars pull out.

Please remember that it is against the law to be on a cell phone in a school zone like Arie Crown. We ask that you refrain from being on any phone so that the utmost attention is being paid for the safety of our students.

If you are parking on Main Street <u>ANY OTHER TIME</u> during the day, please do not park directly in front of the school in order to leave space for deliveries.

BUS INFO: We thank you for your patience as everyone gets used to the new routes and any changes. Concerns and change requests can be emailed to bus@ariecrown.org. Keep in mind that in order to be fair to all the students, routes need to be streamlined as much as possible and, as such, any changes or stop additions will be very difficult to get approved. Please refer to the busing letter which was emailed with the bus registration forms.

Helpful tip – Talk to your neighbors to see if you can arrange a "busstop pool." You can take turns meeting the bus and making sure that everyone's children get home safely.

Thanks again for your understanding and patience. Looking forward to another successful year of busing!

LIBRARY

Welcome back to the library. We are looking forward to a year of great reading and discussions.



Welcome back to school!

We are pleased to announce our new **Middos Matter** initiative for all students in grades K-8. Middos Matter is an Arie Crown-designed program to teach school-wide behavior expectations. It is based on PBIS — Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports, which has been used successfully in schools across the world for over 20 years.

Middos Matter focuses on **positive** behaviors – it is about <u>what</u> to do rather than what <u>not</u> to do. Teachers explain expectations clearly and celebrate their students' success. In addition, teachers, administrators and all adults in the school model the positive behaviors themselves. Everyone is on the same page, using the same language. Consistency is key.

What will this look like on the first day of school?

When students come to school, they will notice expectations posted in the hallways, common areas and classrooms. Students will be introduced to our three school-wide expectations: **Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe** through an opening assembly. This instruction, modeling and practice will continue all year.

What if my student is struggling to learn the new procedures?

The Middos Matter program includes lots of repetition, practice and reteaching as necessary. This is a new program and we will spend time working with everyone to ensure they are successful. Activities are designed to reach all ages and to be fun as well.

How can I learn more?

We have a talented "Tier I Team" of teachers who have worked tirelessly over the summer to create the Middos Matter program. They will be answering questions through email, posting information around the school and on our website and Facebook pages, and sending articles to the Yediot to keep everyone up to date. We will also share tips for things you can do at home.


