

We were so excited to get back to school after Sukkos. So much learning has been going on in every classroom and we are super proud of it. Library and gym, as well as "Emuna through Art" has begun. There is an energy in the building coming from the classrooms and we couldn't be happier!

Kitah Alef has been working hard reviewing their letters and sounds, eagerly waiting to start learning the nekudos. Thank you Morah Shoshana for the beautiful Shabbos Puzzle as a prize for the students who did their summer homework.

It was a very big week for our Super Second Graders. Mazel Tov to Morah Grinblatt and Morah Schwartz's classes for starting Chumash. May you all be zoche to always bring nachas to your parents and Hashem!

Morah Cziment and Morah Feigenbaums' classes have both started Kriah Groups. To best help each student gain accuracy and fluency with their Kriah, each class is split into 3 groups. The groups meet every day at a set time and are working on the Kriah Berura book as they are reviewing the rules for proper reading. Rabbi Raiz and Rabbi Goldwag are deep into Chumash. Walking the hallway you can hear the Pesukim being taught and reviewed with an excitement.

Third Grade girls started a Yedios Klaliyos Program. Using the Chayeinu Program, the girls are learning the information in class; singing the material to help them master the fundamental Yedios. As each level is mastered the girls are acknowledged.

It has been so wonderful to see everyone back in school this week! In general studies, the students have been enjoying seeing their friends, getting back into routine, and really digging into their learning.

Our 1st Graders are already becoming elementary students. In math, the students are learning math vocabulary and working on addition facts. In reading, they are learning the habits of being a good reader and getting lots of time to read.

Our 2nd Graders have been finishing their first chapter of math and are excited to move into their chapter on number patterns starting with skip counting. They have been enjoying their first social studies unit on communities and have learned about rural, urban, and suburban communities.

Our 3rd Graders were so excited to break into math groups. They love getting to know other students in their grade. They are working hard on geometry skills and place value. Reading groups have begun in third grade with the students being challenged at their independent reading level.

All 1st-3rd Graders are working on their first writing unit which is a small moment personal narrative. It is amazing to see the growth from each grade as I observe in the different classrooms.

I am so proud of all the students and teachers for their amazing hard work and a successful start to the year.

#### **IMPORTANT LICE SCREENING NOTICE**



Lice Check is Sunday, October 10 9:00–11:45 a.m. (There are no evening hours)

#### Please note the new procedures for Sunday's check:

- 1. Everyone regardless of vaccination status must wear a mask.
- 2. We are requesting that only one parent per family bring their child(ren) to lice check.
- 3. Please enter the building through the Kenton Street doors. There will be a lice committee member at the door who will sign you in and let you inside the building when a spot becomes available for your child(ren) to be checked.
- 4. Once you have entered the building you will be directed to the Bais Medrash or a 100 wing classroom for your lice check.
- 5. The Kenton doors will be closed at 11:45 a.m. and we will not be checking after that time. This is crucial for Sunday school dismissal.

#### Review of policies for lice screening:

- 1. All students must be checked at lice screening days. Boys in grades 4-8 will be checked during school on Sunday.
- 2. All students' hair must be clean and dry (no mousse, gel or hairspray). Hair that is dirty or wet will not be checked.
- 3. If you have extenuating circumstances and will be unavailable on the lice screening day, it is your responsibility to contact our lice committee parent liaison, Malkie Kohn, at malkiefriedman@aol.com by Sunday morning to set up a time to be checked. Please note that checks are only available during daylight hours.
- 4. If your child does not attend lice check and you have not contacted the lice committee to make alternate arrangements, s/he will not be admitted to class the following day. You will be called to pick your child up from school and wait with him/her in the office until s/he is checked. Checks will begin at school Monday morning no earlier than 9:15 AM. Parents must wait with their children until a lice checker becomes available. Students will not be checked without a parent present.
