## Emunah through Art News

In "Emunah through Art" we learn to look at the world around us and the world within us to develop and deepen our relationships with Hashem. Our intention this year is to build our understanding that everything that happens comes from Hashem, is for

the best and for the purpose of bringing us closer to Him. We will study the marvelous creations of Hashem with new eyes to see and appreciate the miracles that constantly surround us. We are training our hearts and minds to look upwards and connect with Hashem through it all.

3rd grade girls learned about the brilliance of the magnificent dandelion and the fascinating way Hashem in His wisdom, designed this "original parachute".

3rd grade boys learned how to look at an apple with "Emunah eyes" to see the wisdom in its design and to say "It can only be Hashem!"

4th grade girls saw pictures of many beautiful butterflies that live around the world and talked about the miracle of the cocoon from which the butterfly emerges anew—that Hashem is teaching us that we too can grow and change for the positive.

4th grade boys drew the earth full of different patterns, learning that other than choosing how we act, Hashem is in complete control of everything that happens.

5th grade girls drew a mountain range and talked about looking at nature and training our minds to think about Hashem through the beauty we see. Both 4th and 5th grades worked on a watercolor background using the wet on wet technique. As we let go of control, watching the colors blend together on their own, it drove home the lesson that Hashem alone guides and directs everything in our lives down to the tiniest detail.


