

DID YOU HEAR THE 1ST-3RD GRADE NEWS?



We are so happy with all the incredible learning happening in our classes. The song of Tefilla, Kriah and Chumash fill the hallways every morning as the students start another day of learning.

Kriah is in full swing. Kitah Alef is learning their nekudos, putting letters and sounds together and reading short words. Kriah groups in second and third grade are going strong. Each class is split into 3 or 4 groups meeting a few times a week and mastering their levels.

The students of third grade have begun Shemona Esrei. The tefillah was introduced with a powerful story together with a classroom discussion about our connection with Hashem. Watching the students learn how to daven and hear the tefillos is inspiring. May Hashem always answer to our tefillos

Thank you to Rabbi Samber and Rabbi Kirshner for the Baruch Levin Concert last Friday. The joy in school was palpable as the music filled the room. We are so lucky to have had an opportunity to sing together as a school.

Our 1st-3rd graders are working hard and learning so much!

In every classroom in grades 1-3, we are excited to be implementing an Executive Functions curriculum. Each year, in 1st, 2nd, and 3rd grade, our students will learn skills that build on the year before to help them develop strong student and life skills. Over the course of the year, students will focus on seven main areas of executive functioning: classroom structure, materials management, time management, study strategies, goal setting, decision making, and learning preferences. We will also learn strategies to help with self-regulation and flexible thinking. The students will have 2-3 lessons each month focusing on one or two of these categories.

In October, the students are learning about time management as well as study strategies. The first and second graders learned how to create a list in order to help them remember what needs to be done. This is a precursor to learning how to use an assignment notebook. The 1st graders learned how to create a picture list that would help them remember important information. They learned about making a list of what needs to be done in the morning to get ready for school as well as a list of what needs to be packed in a lunchbox. 2nd graders learned about the picture lists as well as written checklists with the same goals. Our 3rd graders are learning how to use their assignment notebooks in order to keep track of their daily assignments as well as how to keep track of tests and quizzes so they can learn to study a little each night and plan their time well.

For study strategies, our 1st and 2nd graders learned the steps of being a good listener. They then practiced listening to oral directions for a coloring page. They learned about whole body listening which includes: eyes watching the person speaking, ears are listening, mouth is quiet, and hands and body are still. Everyone did a great job! Our 3rd graders are learning strategies to use in Writing Workshop. They learned strategies to help them brainstorm ideas as well as strategies to help them edit and revise their learning.
