After learning about Rivkah's chesed of giving water at the well, the Nursery classes each created their own wells with a pulley system to use in the classroom. The Yeladim then created their own miniature wells to bring home.







This week in Stay and Play, we were learning all about different safari animals. We had SO much fun making our cute lion snack. We had fun making safari animals to be displayed in our halls.

















The Kindergarten Yeladim are already learning the letter daled!! They are so excited to learn the sound and how to write each letter. They are also learning words that begin with each letter.







The Kindergarten Yeladim learned about the Mitzvah of kindness from the way Rivkah not only gave Eliezer water to drink, but also gave water to his camels.















This week in Kindergarten, we had a lot of fun learning the letters C and K. After reading the book, "If I Built a Car", the children brainstormed cool ideas for their ideal car, illustrating and journaling their thoughts. In Science we tried an interesting STEM experiment - how to make the ideal ramp to make a toy car zoom the farthest. We learned how momentum helps the car go farther, the same way people get momentum when they take a running start before jumping. We constructed a long ramp out of paper, trying to figure out which type of paper makes the best ramp for the car to go further and the best angle for the ramp. We also began thinking like scientists, asking questions such as, does the size of the car matter? Does the material matter (plastic or wood)? Does the color of the car matter? Our best results came with using construction paper. We also saw the effects of momentum when we learned about kangaroos and how far they can jump (up to 30 feet!) Using string, we marked 30 feet on the grass. We measured how far each child could jump with and without a running start and discovered that the momentum really made us go farther, although none of us came close to jumping like a kangaroo!

































To better understand the concept of getting water from a well and the chesed Rivkah did, the Pre Nursery Yeladim did an experiment. Each child had the opportunity to try pulling a bucket full of water just using a rope and pulley with a crank. We realized that we're lucky today to be able to get water easily from a sink and that it was a very big chesed for Rivkah to get enough water for 10 thirsty camels.


