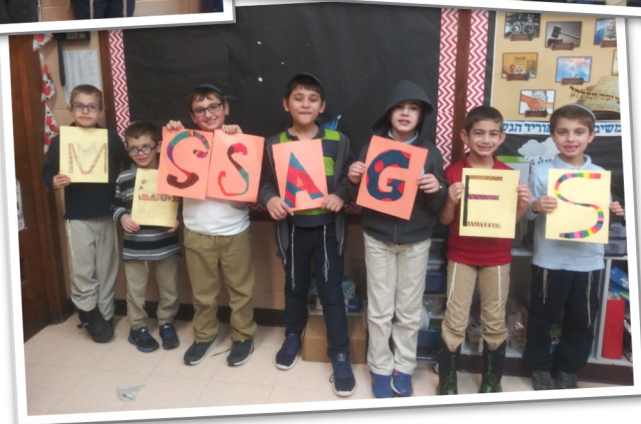
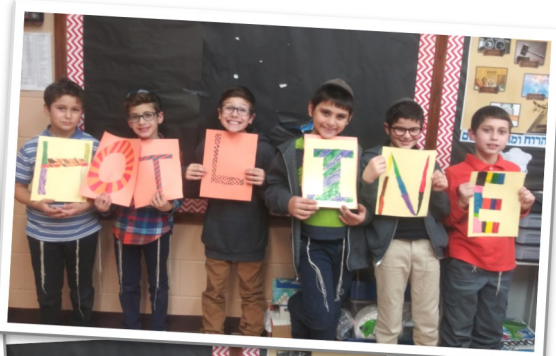
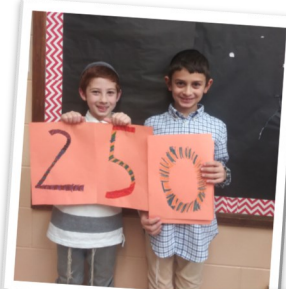
## 3rd Grade News

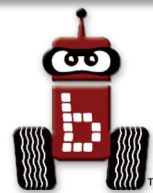

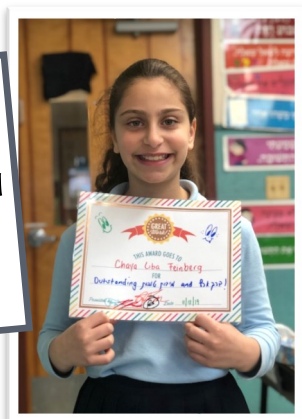

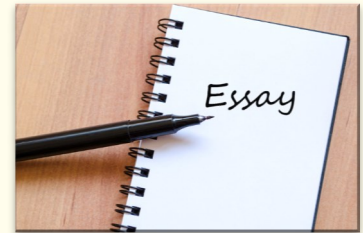

Arie Crown's Middos Matter school-wide initiative is continuing strong! "Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe" is our theme.

A note from an Arie Crown teacher:

Dear Mrs. Swann,

I believe that one probable consequence of Middos Matter is that in receiving positive feedback from their teachers and school, students will get a better sense of who they are (i.e., their self-esteem will blossom). Because I worked so closely with my last year's students, I know from comments they have made to me how they can underestimate their intelligence and inner goodness. They can be reticent to take school seriously and apply themselves, concerned they might let themselves down, or others might laugh. The teachers know them so well & know exactly what they are doing in writing All-Star referrals or giving MM tokens. Last week, seeing one of these students in the hallway on the way to this year's class, I let him know how proud I was of him. He absolutely beamed. He hadn't seen the All Star list in the Yediot, so I told him where to look. The All-Star list is like blowing oxygen to a young fire, and I suspect will positively impact much more than behavior of the students at Arie Crown.

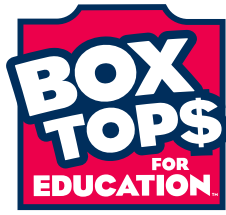

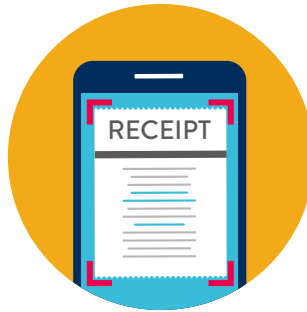
