4th Grade News

Measuring Mass

Mrs. Quiroga's 4th grade Boys class went outside to find objects to measure mass. Their instructions were to find objects that were of equal size/shape/form and try to guess which one had the greater mass. They recorded their observations one day, and then on Friday of last week they had used a balance to check their observations. Here are some of their thoughts and observations:

Aharon Zisook and Daniel Raccah – Observation of Pencil and Plastic

"We thought that the pencil was heavier and had more mass. We thought the pencil weighed more. It did weigh more, but mass is how much matter something has in it. It did have more mass, which is what we thought, but it was closer than we thought it would be."

Jonah Goizman, Daniel Leibtag, Bennett Kroll – Observation of Darker vs. Lighter woodchip

"We discovered that the darker woodchip had more mass than the lighter woodchip, even though it had more holes and it was the same size"

Kivi Samberg – Observation of a Rock with "stuff in it" vs. Another rock with nothing in it.

"We found a rock that had stuff in it, however the other rock had more mass. We had so much fun doing this experiment."

Avi Hunter - Observation of two rocks

"I explored mass on a balance. I was surprised that a rock with bigger holes has more mass compared to a rock about the same size with much smaller holes."

Ezra Trilisky and Elya Gendelman – Observation of rock and woodchip

"It doesn't mean if an object is bigger it has more mass. For example, we had a rock and a woodchip. The woodchip was bigger but it had less mass."

Avromi Applebaum – Observation of small log and a rock

"Some stuff has more mass than you think. A small log had 296 grams and a rock had 255 grams. They were about the same size, and we thought the rock had more mass, but the log actually had more mass."

Ezzie Lebedinsky – Observation of bigger rocks and smaller rocks

"You can think that a big rock is bigger, and has more mass than a smaller, but I found out that a few small rocks actually have more mass than the one big rock".






