You Can't Rain on Arie Crown Hebrew Day School's Parade!

Like many schools, Arie Crown Hebrew Day School has had to learn quickly and efficiently how to shift to remote learning for its students as the physical building remains closed per Illinois's stay-at-home order. While the school's administration and staff have worked tirelessly to make this a successful transition for their students and families, they have not lost sight of the "little things" that make the school year so special for their students.

This attitude was on full display as AC@Home (the school's newly dubbed remote learning program) took flight for the school's annual Yom Ha'atzmaut celebration. On a "normal" year, Israel's Independence Day overruns the school with a full day of activities including special student council run educational activities, camel rides, blue and white doughnuts and more. Despite the challenges of being at home, the school coordinated a full program that will certainly be considered one of the highlights of the school year.

The day began with the regular daily Tefillah routine via Zoom video with the students, and was then enhanced with a special guest Hallel prayer led by famed Jewish singer Shlomo Katz. Shlomo was able to share inspirational words with the students before the next segment of the program kicked off. This consisted of the singing of the Israeli National Anthem, Hatikva led by Efrayim Prero, as Ariel Campbell, with the help of his daughter Mia, raised the flag in front of the school. Both Efrayim and Ariel are Arie Crown graduates who now send their children to the school. This was to be followed by a scheduled drone parade which would allow students to wave at the drone with their Isreali flags that had been pre-distributed to families in a Yom Haatzmaut care package.

But, as we know, especially in the "Coronavirus Age", man plans and G-d laughs. The school had planned for







the aforementioned drone to fly through students' neighborhoods, capturing families celebrating Israel's independence day safely outside their houses. However, heavy rain brought that plan to a halt. Scrambling to ensure that students weren't disappointed, Drone Media Chicago and Arie Crown's Early Childhood Director, Shoshana Safirstein, drove through the streets of West Rogers Park, Skokie, and Lincolnwood, filming students and parents waving flags, wearing their rain gear and holding umbrellas! This, along with the entire program, was all live-streamed on Zoom and Facebook, with a running commentary from school principal Rabbi Eli Samber and the school's Assistant Principal Rabbi Menachem Kirshner.

Throughout the parade, Rabbi Samber spoke with several special guests including:

- •Mr. Lonnie Nasatir, President of the JUF, who explained the importance of having a Jewish state
- •Rabbi Ephraim Rimmel former YU Torah Mitzion of Chicago Fellow who lives in Israel, offering inspirational words to students
- Tamir Goodman, Jewish basketball star, who described his career and his life in Israel
- •Rabbi Zev Shandalov, former Chicagoan and current resident of Maale Adumim, sharing words of Torah
- •Rabbi Shlomo and Susie Schwartz, Arie Crown alumni and former teachers who reminisced about Yom Ha'atzmaut celebrations during their years at Arie Crown in the 1960's

The program was truly a day of celebration that no one at the school will soon forget.




4th Grade News
