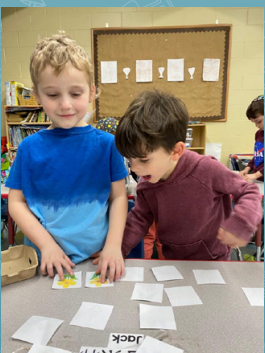

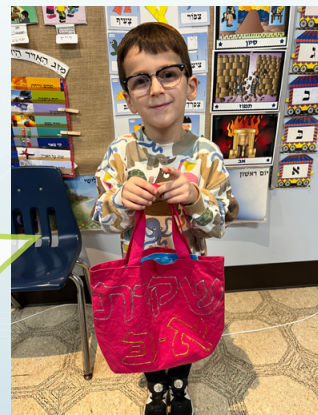


In Stay & Play this week, we learned about Spring. We planted tomatoes, peas and daisies. We had so much fun painting tulips using a fork as a paintbrush! We also used our pinky fingers to paint the stems. We enjoyed making our own flower creations out of play dough. The class also had fun playing Spring themed matching games and patterning with flowers.



In this week's Parsha, the Kindergarten Yeladim learned what kinds of animals, fish, and birds are kosher.

The Kindergarten Yeladim are now learning the letter **א**. They learned different words that start with **א**. You would be so impressed to see how many words they already know!



The Kindergarten Yeladim are very busy getting ready for Pesach.



This week in Kindergarten we learned the vowel team 'ou' and the sound it makes in words such as mouse, house, loud, and found. We learned a great lesson about the power of words in a book we read called 'Ouch! Moments' which teaches children that hearing mean and hurtful words can hurt as much as real 'boo-boos'. We learned practical strategies to help empower kids to stand up to hurtful and mean language. The children did a terrific demonstration related to this subject. Using toothpaste (yes, toothpaste!) the children were better able to understand the power of words. They squeezed the toothpaste out of two tubes. That was the easy part. Challenged with putting the toothpaste back in the tube proved impossible. What lesson did we learn? Like the toothpaste, words are easy to get out. And like the toothpaste, once they're out they can't be put back in. Be careful with your words! A powerful lesson for both children and adults!
