

* 3rd-8th grade boys did a cool virtual escape room thanks to Rabbi Hartstein and Rabbi Gottesman.






1st and 2nd Grade Activity

While it may not have been so easy to get to Israel for real this Yom Ha'atzmaut, the First and Second Graders were still able to go on THEIR special annual trip to "Israel" in the Arie Crown gym (with a few tweaks to still be able to abide by Covid rules). The Kindergarten classes at the "big" Arie Crown joined also!

Each child carrying his/her own Teudat Zehut (identity card) and Ziploc bag (for souvenirs), was able to stop and visit at many sites in Israel including writing a note at the Kotel, helping decorate a flag at the Knesset, digging in the sand and translating Hebrew words at the beach in Tel Aviv, and going through an obstacle course at an army base in Latrun. The Yeladim answered questions about the people buried in M'orat Hamachpeila and questions about Rachel Imeinu at Kever Rachel. They also got to "fish" at the underwater aquarium in Eilat, be in a boat race in Haifa, and find places in Israel on the map at the Doar (post office). At the Neot Kedumim nature preserve, the Yeladim did a Shivat Haminim puzzle and they also visited the Gan Zayit (Olive Garden) at Kibbutz Yavne where they identified whether certain items were part of the Shivat Haminim. At the art center in Tzfat, the Yeladim colored in a beautiful Havdala candle. Of course, no trip would be a trip without taking a picture at a Tah Tzilum (Photo Booth) or stopping at a Kiosk where the children got their "Israel" sunglasses and "Israel" hand sanitizer!

The souvenirs included a map of Israel "keychain", a Semel HaMedina magnet, a Hatikva bookmark, a red string bracelet, a candle, a seashell, a fish, a boat, army dog tags, and lots and lots of special stickers!

*Rabbi Kirshner for ALL his support.


*Finally-A big thank you to Rabbi Samber for allowing us to do this activity every year.



Kindergarten celebrated with a Jolly Phonics party this week! This party commemorated the completion of our formal phonics program that taught our kiddos all of their letters and their corresponding sounds. We celebrated by playing the "mystery bag" game, wherein each child was assigned a letter and needed to bring 1 item that started with that letter to school in a sealed bag. Each student wore a vest representing their letter. Each child stood in front of the class and gave clues to help the others guess what was in the bag! The students loved being the center of attention! We also made Jolly Phonics collages using a template and dyed alphabet pasta! Other activities included reading Chicka Chicka Boom Boom, making an alphabet tree as illustrated in the book, using alphabet cereal to represent the letters climbing the tree, snacking on alphabet cookies, searching for both capital and lower case letter cards that begin a chosen picture card, matching lower case letters to their capital partners on a worksheet, singing an "Alphabet Rap" and reading A to Z books. The children even received a special certificate award to take home with their workbooks! We had a busy time celebrating our students' achievements!



The Yeladim learned about numerous Mitzvos this week. One Mitzvah to which they were able to really relate, was honoring parents. Indeed, not only did the Yeladim make a placard for each of their parent's chairs, they also pledged to listen to them!

This week we are learning about monsters. We have made monsters with our playdough. We have made monsters on plates.



The pre-nursery has been having a great time counting the Omer on our special bulletin board, playing outside, and decorating cupcakes!
