IMPORTANT LICE SCREENING NOTICE



Lice Check is Sunday, May 1 9:00–11:45 a.m. (There are no evening hours.)

Review of policies for lice screening:

- 1. All students must be checked at lice screening days. Boys in grades 4-8 will be checked during school on Sunday.
- 2. All students' hair must be clean and dry (no mousse, gel or hairspray). Hair that is dirty or wet will not be checked.
- 3. If you have extenuating circumstances and will be unavailable on the lice screening day, it is your responsibility to contact our lice committee parent liaison, Malkie Kohn, at 773-410-0661 by Sunday morning to set up a time to be checked. Please note that checks are only available during daylight hours.
- 4. If your child does not attend lice check and you have not contacted the lice committee to make alternate arrangements, s/he will not be admitted to class the following day. You will be called to pick your child up from school and wait with him/her in the office until s/he is checked. Checks will begin at school Monday morning no earlier than 9:15 AM. Parents must wait with their children until a lice checker becomes available. Students will not be checked without a parent present.



They also made special "friendshape" projects to show that we may come in all shapes and sizes, but we are all special and can all be friends! We also began counting the Omer in our classroom and can't wait to fill up the days on our classroom chart and reach Shavuos!

























This week, the Nursery Stay and Play learned about rain! We discussed the water cycle and did an amazing experiment to illustrate this. We took a jar and filled it with water. We then sprayed shaving cream on top (the clouds). The Yeladim each had a turn using a dropper to drop colored water onto the "clouds". The clouds got heavy and finally it rained! How cool! The Yeladim also had fun jumping on "puddles" in the Gross Motor Room! Finally, we created an edible water cycle using bananas, blueberries, apples, and pretzels. Yum! What a blast!













Kindergarten is counting the Omer each day. We also learned the letter ק and the word קוק (monkey). We completed a fun Art Hub for Kids lesson and learned how to draw our very own monkeys!

















Kindergarten celebrates Earth Week! We learned about and created models of the earth and how it moves around the sun, why it is important that earth is the "perfect" place to sustain life, and how it is so important that we take care of the planet that we live on. 
