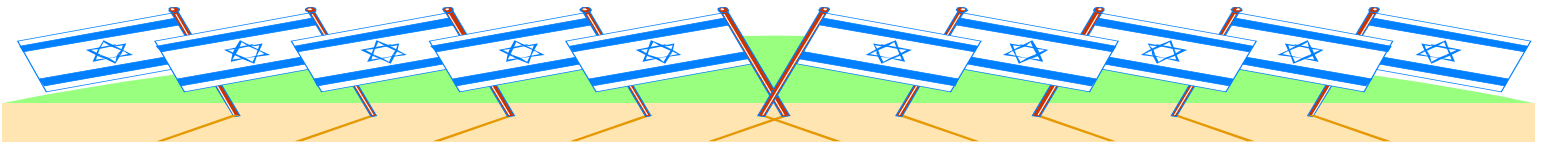

* The First and Second graders got to tour Israel in our gym with a special carnival arranged by Mrs. Matanky and run by our 8th grade boys.

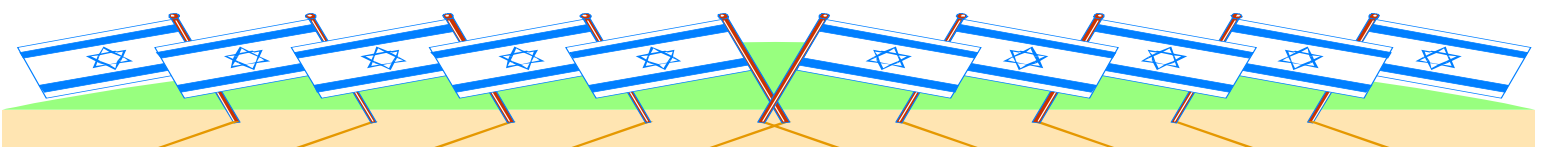


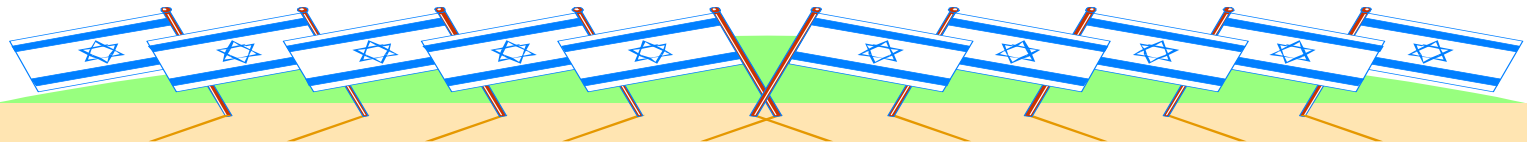
* 3rd-8th grade boys played Tzahal style "Capture the Israeli Flag" with Rabbi Scher.

They came well equipped—each student with their own Teudat Zehut (identity card) that they had filled out before coming, a lanyard and I.D. badge, and a bag for all their souvenirs. They traveled all the way up north to Tzefat where they made stained glass pictures in the art colony and down to Eilat, where they visited the underground aquarium and each got a "fish". They visited Haifa for a boat race, Tel Aviv to dig in the sand at the beach, and in Yerushalayim—the Kotel where they wrote a note and the Knesset where they colored in a flag to put onto the big flag. Latrun, where there is an Israeli Tank Memorial, was another stop that cannot be missed on a trip to "Israel." They stopped at the "Doar" (post office) and were given maps of Israel keychains and also at a Ta Tzilum (photo booth) where they were able to take a souvenir picture. The Arie Crown tourists had a wonderful visit to "Eretz Yisrael" and we all hope that L'shana Habba'ah B'Yerushalayim!

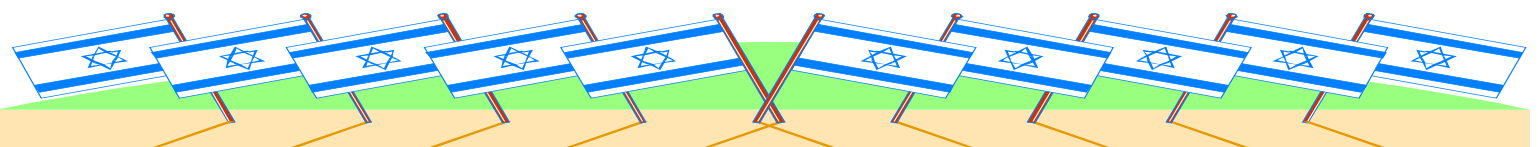

Walder Science Workshop News

We are having another round of amazing workshops run through the Walder Science Center and led by Mr. Kark. The students, and teachers, are having a wonderful time with all of the hands on experiments.

Color – Grades 1-2

This week, our young scientists studied color with Walder Science. Numerous experiments were conducted taking the primary colors and making secondary colors, tertiary colors and more. The young scientists saw that when all the primary colors were mixed, the result was a very dark, almost black solution. They then saw that using chromatography paper, black colors could be separated out into their primary colors. A food coloring underwater eruption was made where colors kept rising and falling in a clear container of water and oil.



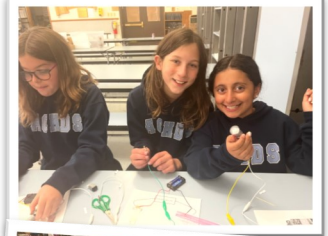
Siphons – Grades 3-4

Walder Science introduced a new concept – siphons - to our 3rd and 4th graders. A siphon uses a combination of atmospheric pressure and gravity to carry liquids (usually water) from a high location to a lower location without the use of a pump. This can occur even when part of the flow through the hose takes the liquid uphill. The students used straws and tubing to make their siphons. They also learned how a toilet flushes and rids the contents in the toilet bowl through a siphoning mechanism. To mimic a functioning toilet, students made a "toilet cup" that completely drains after being sufficiently filled.



Electricity – Grades 5-6

Walder Science really engaged the 5th and 6th graders with hands-on experiments involving current electricity. They learned that a basic electric circuit must have a power source, wires and some type of a resistor (eg. Light bulb, motor). They built their own circuits and discovered that an LED light will only allow the electricity to flow in one direction. They also experimented by changing the connections on a motor and noticed that it spun in opposite directions when the wires were changed around. Different materials were also explored to see which were good conductors of electricity and which were not.



Magnets – Grades 7-8

Next week, Walder Science will bring many experiments on magnets to our 7th and 8th graders. They will learn that scientists think that the center of the Earth is made of solid and liquid iron. It is this iron core that gives the Earth its magnetic field and why a compass works like it does. This magnetic field (together with the solar wind) is responsible for the beautiful colors in the sky around the North Pole (Northern lights/Aurora Borealis). The students will see how a compass works and is affected by magnetic fields, they will make their own working compass. Students will experiment with a bar magnet and iron filings. Using these items they will see the magnetic field lines of a bar magnet. They will also investigate how like poles repel and unlike poles attract. They will also make their own electro-magnets and see how an iron nail wrapped around with insulated wire becomes magnetic when electricity is passed through the wire.
