Dear Arie Crown Family,

As we enter the first שבת of the year, a new beginning, our feelings are one and the same - this is not the new beginning we were hoping for. The תורה tells us in the last פסוק of this week's פרשה that נח was the one who saved himself and his family. Noach's greatest quality was that of חן (which not coincidentally are the same letters of his name). Defining the Middah of חן is tricky. How does one become endeared to another? The answer is not in any one specific action, rather in just being your best self. נח worked hard on being his best self.

Over the past few days we have watched our תלמידים and תלמידות internalize that their brothers and sisters in ארץ ישראל need their help. Watching them say תהילים, hearing the ideas that they came up with to raise money for, and sensing the atmosphere of just trying to be our best selves as a זכות for those that need our help right now, has been inspiring. Our message at school has shared no alarming words - just that our brothers and sisters in ארץ ישראל are going through a hard time - yet the students felt the need for action and have responded. As we have gathered for תהילים, and perhaps from the conversations that they have been having with their families at home, the older students have come to recognize that this is a serious situation - and they have responded. We are super proud of them.

In this weeks Yediot you will see regular routines taking place at school. Maintaining this normalcy for our children despite our hearts being so heavy is crucial right now. And of course, let us not forget that the כח of the learning and good מידות of בית רבן serves as the greatest creator of protection during these difficult times.

The Students of Arie Crown Do For Israel

In light of the situation in Israel, our students returned to school after vacation, ready to do their part in any way they could to help support Israel and Am Yisrael. Per the directive of the Vaad Roshei Yeshiva of Torah U'Mesorah, all classes, second grade and up, have been saying an extra Perek of Tehillim each day, in addition to the regular Perakim that they say. Some of the classes have been saying names of Chayalim before they say the Tehillim. In addition, after Minyan each morning, the older boys have also been saying two extra Perakim of Tehillim.

On Thursday, Arie Crown joined in the ATT Tehillim hookup with a message from Rabbi Paysach Krohn followed by Tehillim with many of the ATT schools. During the time the students were not saying Tehillim, there was amazing quiet and respect for everyone davening and those we were davening for. Following the Tehillim, there was a special Mincha for all students in grades 5-8 where Avinu Malkeinu was recited.

In addition to the Bein Adam L'Makom activities that our students have been doing, there are also the Bein Adam L'Chavero activities that are taking place. In some of our General Studies classes, the students wrote letters to the Chayalim to let them know that they were thinking about them and davening for them. Both our 8th Grade Girls and 8th Grade Boys are planning fundraisers to send money to Israel. The girls' money will be used to buy games, toys, and books for children that have been displaced from their homes. The boys' fundraiser will be to benefit the Chayalim. The 8th Grade students will be coming around to classrooms next week to collect the money.

Arie Crown Boys Choir News

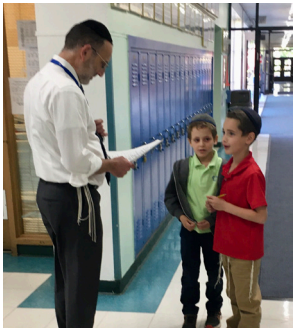
