
Last week, Rabbi Yoni Gold from the ATT presented to our Rabbeim as a mini professional development session.

This week we had a great time learning about Yitzchak, Rivka, Eliezer, Chesed! We created a Chesed Club in our class, complete with club necklaces which we hope will be a tool for teaching Middos throughout the year. Kids who are in the Chesed Club are kind to one another and are always ready to help! We also created a Chesed Bucket which we will IY"H be filling up, one drop-shaped note at a time, with examples of Chesed that the teachers observe in the classroom. The Peachies are also bucket fillers and fill up their bucket with pompoms when they do various acts of kindness!!!! The Peach Room can't wait to earn a prize for all their hard work!!!! Great job Peachies!!!







This week the Nursery Stay n' Play learned all about Teeth!! We learned that we have 20 Milk Teeth and 32 Permanent Teeth! We need Teeth in order to chew (eat), talk and smile!! We discussed how people only get two sets of teeth in their lifetime unlike some animals (like sharks) and that is why correct Teeth hygiene is so important! Brushing, flossing and visiting a Dentist regularly. We did a Science experiment soaking eggs in coke and vinegar. After a few days the hard shell became soft showing how we lose the enamel on our Teeth if we eat sweets and acid food and don't clean them properly. We also had a fun Sensory experience playing with shaving cream and mint toothpaste!! We enjoyed painting with mint toothpaste onto a paper tooth to brush alway all the plaque! We made gums out of pink salt dough and placed white beans (teeth) inside them. What a sight!!

The Kindergarten Yeladim learned that in this week's parsha, Chayei Sarah, what a great Tzadeikes Sarah was.
