
Morah Caplan's class acting out this week's Parsha with our very own Yaakov, Menashe, and Efraim!



KINDERGARTEN





















The Olive Room is so excited to have started our Shabbos Unit! This week is all about Kiddush! We started the week by learning about where grape juice/wine comes from and how it is made. We then used this information to explore making our own grape juice by crushing the grapes with wooden blocks and collecting all the juice! We also enjoyed yummy grapes for snack. Using their fine motor skills, the Yeladim used little gems to decorate their own Kiddush cups for their Shabbos play unit. We also made a special grape juice/wine bottle necklace using shrinky dinks and sharpies! The Yeladim are so excited to continue our Shabbos unit and learn all about Challah next week iY"H!

















This week the Nursery Stay And Play learned all about "Sharing". We read the book 'The Rainbow Fish" by Marcus Phister, to illustrate the lesson of "Sharing". We made an art project of a fish with scales and added one shiny scale. We also made an edible fish using rice cakes and pretzels. The Yeladim made rainbow bracelets which they lovingly created and then shared and exchanged them with each other!! We also discussed soft words and scratchy, hard words that we use when communicating with each other. To illustrate this we worked on a classroom collage of soft and scratchy items (cotton balls, sand paper, foam etc.) What a fun lesson!!









This week in Parsha, the Kindergarten Yeladim learned that Yaakov switched his hands when giving the Bracha of "HaMalach HaGoel" to Menashe and Ephraim. We did an engaging project to demonstrate this action of Yaakov. The class also practiced writing their names with both hands to show hand dominance. We learned that each of us has a hand that is "stronger" (dominant) than the other. For most people it is their right hand. However, interestingly, there are numerous Yeladim in our class whose left hands are stronger. We made a chart to compare how many righties and lefties we have in K3.

The Kindergarten Yeladim were very excited to learn another Nekudah this week. The Kamatz was introduced and we used the hand motion from the letter "u" in Jolly Phonics to help remember its sound. We further reenforced this new sound by sounding out letters with the Kamatz on the Smartboard and white boards.













Additionally, we played a game where I called out the new winter words and the K-kids had to go to each of the items identified by those words. For example, when מעיל was called the Yeladim had to stand by their coats. A good time was had by all.

The Kindergarteners are learning vowel pairs! When two vowels go walking, the first one does the talking! One of our 'oa' words was float. Connecting phonics to science, we took a look at the concept of density and why some things sink and others float. We collected classroom objects, and the children predicted what would happen for each. Next, we tried each item out to see what would happen! The Kindergartners played math games using cards that had numbers and another set that had ten frames (graphic tool). First, the children were each given one card and had to find the other child with the same valued card. Next, they lined them all in order! Write the Room for the sound 'ie'! In this Write The Room activity, the children searched the classroom for the words that match each of the 'ie' pictures on their page and wrote them next to each picture!
