Mrs. Rosenbaum prepared a special activity for the 1st and 2nd grade boys in honor of Rosh Chodesh!



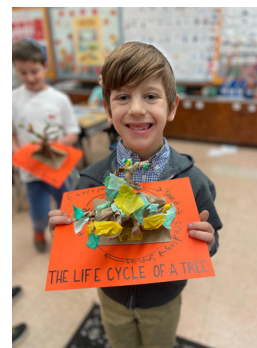
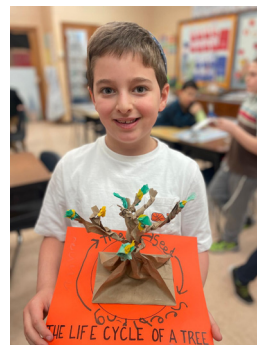
1ST - 8TH BOYS news
