Walder Science News

The Walder Science Action-Reaction workshop allowed our 3rd and 4th graders to delve into Newton's Third Law of Motion: "For every action there is an equal and opposite reaction." In other words, if object #1 exerts a force on object #2, object #2 also exerts an equal and opposite force on object #1. This principle is observed in propelling rockets, jumping, a car accelerating, garden sprinklers, and many more everyday occurrences. To demonstrate this law, students made cars and spinning balloons propelled by air moving in one direction and the car or balloon moving in the opposite direction. Students also saw firsthand that when a car moves forward the wheels push backwards on the ground. They also experimented with marble propelled cars that move in the opposite direction to a rolling marble. The students loved learning about Newton's Third Law of Motion.













Thanks to Walder Science for bringing such an exciting workshop on air pressure to our 5th and 6th graders! They learned that air pressure is caused by the weight of air pressing down on us and other objects. The following concepts were explored with hands-on experiments and demonstrations:

- a. Air pressure increases as temperature increases.
- b. Air pressure decreases as temperature decreases.
- c. Air always moves from high pressure to low pressure.

Interactive experiments involving self-inflating balloons, soda can crushers, mechanical lungs, and "not-so-empty" containers were performed to reinforce the above concepts.


3rd Grade Girls News


