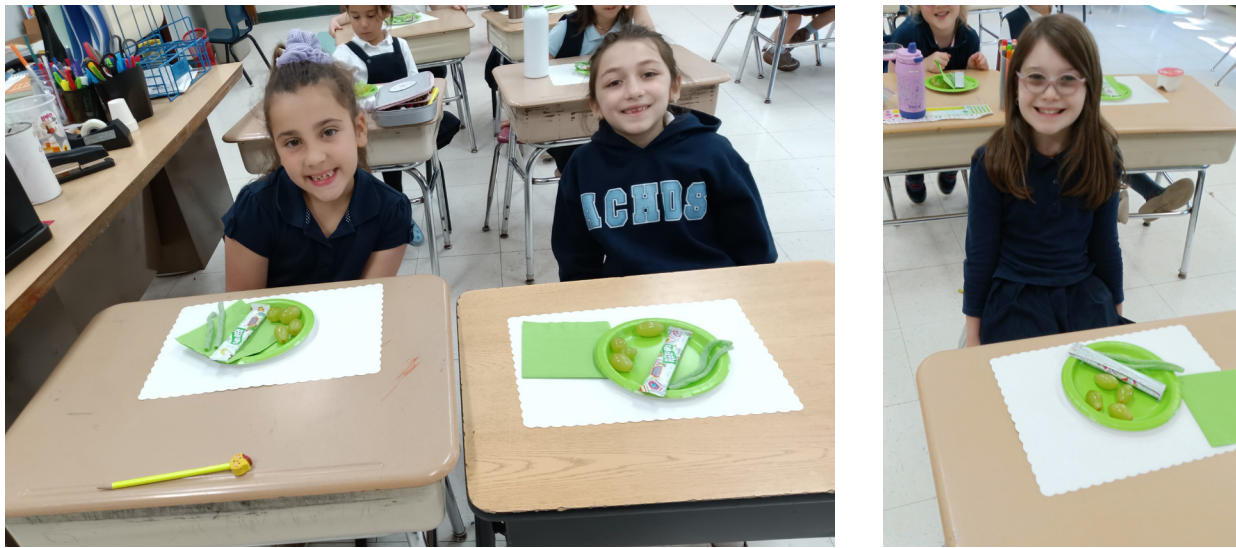

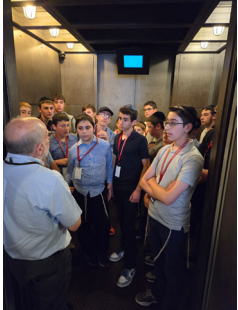
1st and 2nd Grade News by Morah Matanky

On Yom Ha'atzmaut, our First and Second Graders made their annual trip together to "Israel" to tour the country. They came well equipped—each student with their own Teudat Zehut (identity card) that they had filled out before coming, a lanyard and I.D. badge, and a bag for all their souvenirs. They traveled all the way up north to Tzefat where they made stained glass pictures in the art colony and down to Eilat, where they visited the underground aquarium and each got a "fish". They visited Haifa for a boat race, Tel Aviv to dig in the sand at the beach and practice their Hebrew, and Yerushalayim. At the Kotel they wrote notes with their special Tefillot. At the Knesset they played a special tic tac toe game and were given a big Semel HaMedina magnet. At the Hebrew Museum in Yerushalayim, they toured the museum and "gift store" and helped make a banner that says Am Yisrael Chai! Of course a trip to Eretz Yisrael would not be complete without visiting Kever Rachel and Ma'arat HaMachpelah! When the "tourists" got hot and thirsty, they stopped at the "Kiosk" for a drink and a pair of sunglasses to protect their eyes from the sun. At Neot Kedumim, the tourists did a Shivat HaMinim puzzle and received stickers of some of Israel's beautiful flowers. Latrun, where there is an Israeli Tank Memorial, was another stop that cannot be missed on a trip to "Israel." The Yeladim ran through an obstacle course there and received dog tags. They stopped at the "Doar" (post office) and were given maps of Israel keychains and also at a Ta Tzilum (photo booth) where they were able to take a souvenir picture. The Yeladim made a special stop this year at Kibbutz Saad, a religious Kibbutz located right near the Gaza border, which Baruch Hashem was saved on October 7th. The Arie Crown tourists had a wonderful visit to "Eretz Yisrael" and we all hope that soon the war will be over and the hostages will all come home.

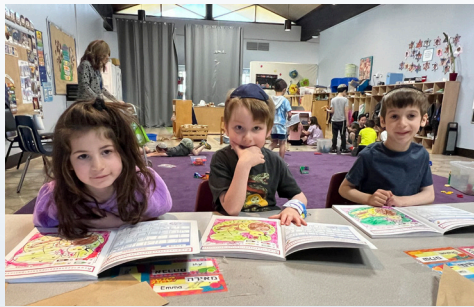
KINDERGARTEN

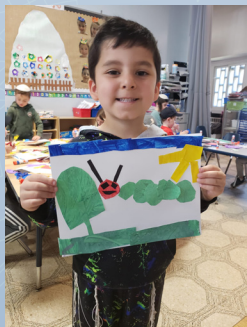
