

This week in Gold Room Stay and Play we learned about teeth and how to keep them healthy! We conducted an experiment with eggs and put one egg into vinegar and one into Coke. We left them for 2 days and were amazed at the results! The Coke had turned the egg shell brown which showed us that if we don't brush our teeth every day and night, they can turn colors! The other egg's shell became soft from the vinegar which showed us that if we eat vinegary and acidic type of foods it can take away our enamel.
