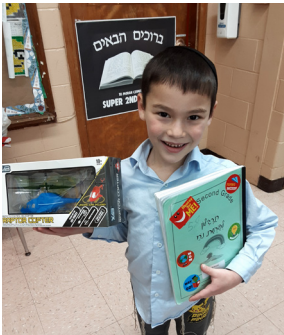


2nd Grade Boys News

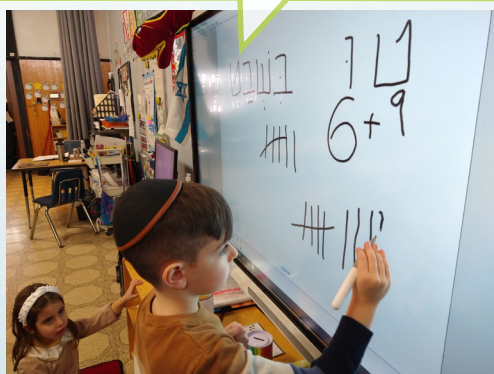

What does Tu B'shvat mean? The Yeladim in Kindergarten know that the Alef Bais letters have numerical value and did the math to find out!



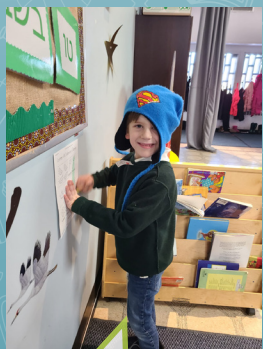
We know the letter Nun!
