This week in Nursery Stay and Play we learned about robots. We made really cool robot vests out of Jewel paper bags. We had fun decorating them and wearing them. February is National Children's Dental Health Month. We all know brushing our teeth is important but in Kindergarten we wanted to understand how important it really is. We conducted an 'eggs-periment' to find out! The students poured coffee, grape juice, apple juice, and Diet Coke into cups and added an egg to each cup. They took another egg, covered it with toothpaste, and put that in grape juice as well. Our young scientists made all sorts of predictions of what would happen to the eggs. Some thought they would crack while others thought they would change colors. We left the eggs for a few days and then observed the changes we saw. The first thing they actually noticed was that the color of the eggs was very different than when we began. Some eggs turned different shades of brown, while the most dramatic change was the egg in the grape juice which turned dark purple. The egg covered in toothpaste was slightly protected but turned a very bright purple. Would brushing our eggs after remove the color? The students tried it and while all the eggs got slightly cleaner, none looked like they did at the start. And what about the inside of the shell? Our scientists were curious to see if the color went through so they cracked the eggs to find out. Unlike our predictions, the inside of the shell remained white. All the children took home a toothbrush and toothpaste and will be sure to brush their teeth daily!
