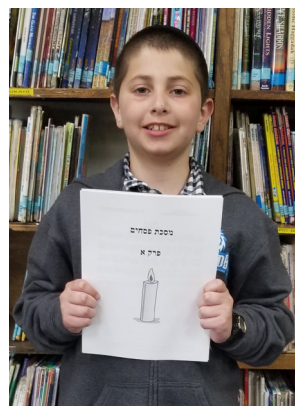

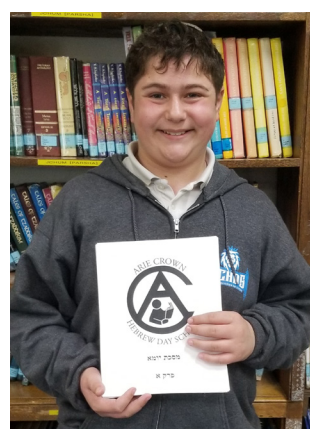
Boys Mishmar Spotlight by Rabbi Gottesman

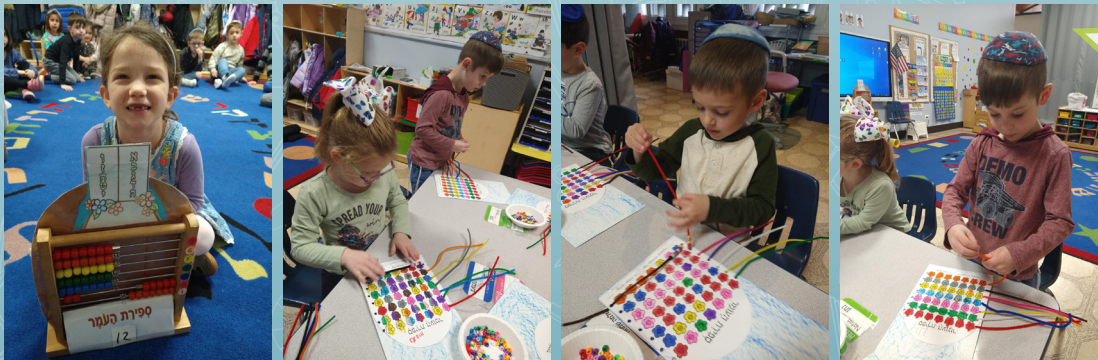
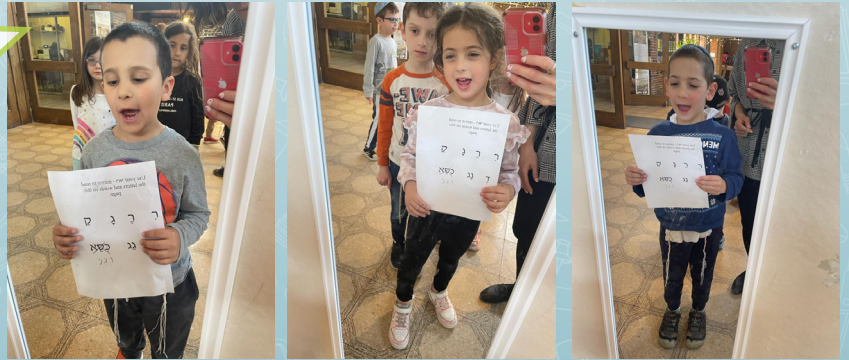


Pre-Nursery Stay & Play - Spring Unit Fun



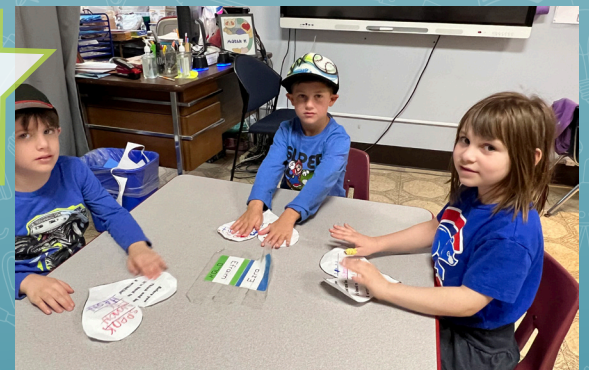
