



# **HAVE A GOOD SHABBOS!!**

# ידילות התורה

"Uva'u Alecha Kol HaBerachos HaEleh VeHisigucha Ki Sishma BeKol Hashem Elokecha"

"All these blessings will come upon you and overtake you if you obey Hashem, your G-d." (Devarim 28:2)

The Torah tells us that blessings come not only when we listen to Hashem, but when we allow ourselves to be "overtaken" by them. Rabbi Yaakov Galinsky explains that this means a person must remain the same—grounded and humble—whether he is poor or wealthy, honored or simple. Blessings are meant to elevate us, but they should never change who we are at our core.

The Rebbe of Peshischa points out that in the geulah blessing of Shemoneh Esrei we praise Hashem as "Great and Awesome, who humbles the haughty and elevates the lowly." Life can feel like a pendulum—sometimes we are raised up, sometimes brought down. Why is that? The Peshischa explains that this cycle only happens when a person becomes arrogant in success. If one remains humble, Hashem allows the blessing to endure. As Chazal teach (Megillah), when Hashem grants greatness, He intends it for generations—unless arrogance causes it to be taken away.

Rabbi Galinsky illustrates this with the story of a pauper in Russia who won the lottery. When the news was delivered late at night, he angrily declared, "Until now I was a poor wretch, but now I am the wealthiest man in town! How dare you disturb me?" His arrogance showed that wealth alone doesn't change a person.

True dignity comes only through humility. A humble person's worth remains steady, allowing him to live with peace in both blessing and challenge.

# AFTER-SCHOOL CLUB DESCRIPTIONS

#### Art with Ms. O

Do you like to doodle, stretch the imagination, and make crafts? For one hour each week the students will have the opportunity to explore their creativity and talents in the Art Club! It is a great place to meet like-minded artists your age and get a chance to focus on projects that are an extension or beyond their regular art class!

#### Ballet with Danceworks (Minimum 10 girls)

A structured lesson focused on classical dance technique, emphasizing strength, flexibility, posture, and coordination through a combination of barre and center exercises. Classes follow a specific format, usually starting with exercises at the barre to warm up and build technique, followed by complex movements in the center, and often finishing with a "reverence". Dancers learn foundational movements, ballet terminology, proper body alignment, and the distinctive "turnout" of the legs, which helps foster grace, discipline, and a strong dance foundation for other styles.

#### Hip Hop with Danceworks (Minimum 10 girls)

Classes focus on coordination, body isolations, rhythmic movement, and stamina, usually set to contemporary hip hop and pop music. Beyond technique, a hip hop class encourages creative expression, improvisation (freestyle), confidence-building, and performance skills.

#### Battle of the Books with Mrs. DeAngelis

Battle of the Books Club is a read-aloud session for fifth grade girls. We will be reading titles from the official Battle of the Books list. While listening, girls may doodle, color, or eat a snack as they enjoy the story. Our first selection will be The Wolves of Willoughby Chase. After we finish the novel, we'll write the required log together, and then choose our next Battle of the Books selection. This club is a great way to relax at the end of the day and enjoy listening to a good book, while also helping to complete another book from the list. At the same time, it offers a wonderful opportunity to prepare for the Battle of the Books competition.


